# Saturday September 15th

Weather: some light cloud in the morning but otherwise warm sunshine all day

#### Portland Bill, 0900

We started our weekend with a few minutes sea-watching at the Bill. A few Gannets, Shags, Cormorants and Fulmars were all we could find though so we walked north along the Eastcliffs to look for migrants. At first we could only find Rock Pipits but soon Wheatears started to turn up and it wasn't long before we had seen ten or more. A flock of six Oystercatchers were found near the shoreline whilst overhead small flocks of Swallows and Meadow Pipits headed south along the cliffs. Looking downwards for once a couple of late-flowering Autumn Lady's Tresses were found in the grass at our feet. Calling in to Portland Bird Observatory we learnt that little had been seen that morning so we moved on to the Observatory Quarry in the hope of seeing the resident Little Owl. The bird was nowhere to be seen but we did see a Whitethroat and enjoyed a very close overhead view of a male Sparrowhawk. Some interesting insects were seen here too including a Small Copper, a Common Blue and a Roesel's Bush-cricket all on the same Greater Knapweed plant!

#### High Angle Battery, 1200

More Common Blues and Small Coppers here including some very fresh males. Speckled Wood, Small Heath and Red Admiral were also seen in a morning that was starting to produce more butterflies than birds.

## Ferrybridge, 1300

Returning to bird-watching our lunch stop added lots of new species to the day's list including Sandwich Tern, Ringed Plover, Dunlin, Sanderling and a single Mediterranean Gull. The highlight was a first-year Yellow-legged Gull conveniently stood next to a young Herring Gull and an adult Great Black-backed Gull for comparison. Away from the shoreline a pair of Skylarks proved challenging to locate but in the end showed well.

Arriving at this unique town-centre reserve we started out with a very brief but close view of a Kingfisher in a hurry. Then we were told that a Cattle Egret had been seen at the far northern end. So the group split into two halves, one choosing to stay and look for Bearded Tits and the other heading off to the North Screen. Both groups did well with the first group seeing or hearing Great Crested, Little Grebe, Bearded Tit and Cetti's Warbler while the second group found no less than five Cattle Egrets, at least twenty Yellow Wagtails and a very fine Wasp Spider.

## Sunday September 16th

Weather: long sunny periods for most of the day

Arne RSPB Reserve, 1000

We had literally just got out of the van when one of the star birds of the weekend appeared in the shape of a Firecrest just outside the toilet block! "Flushed" with success we walked out to Shipstall Point were we were very lucky to get a quick glimpse of a fly-over Tree Pipit. Sadly the heathland around Arne Hill, normally a hot-spot for Dartford Warblers failed to produce even a single call, although conditions were perfect. Reaching the hide we found hundreds of Curlews, a single Redshank and a very impressive flock of twenty-six Spoonbills.

After lunch we spent the afternoon on Coombe Heath, stopping on the way to search for Raft Spiders. This was a successful search resulting in up to ten spiders being found, with the help of an RSPB volunteer. Reaching the tidal inlet known as Middlebere Lake a large flock of Black-tailed Godwits was found to be hiding several Knot. A Greenshank in the distance was the final addition to the weekend's impressive tally of nine species of waders.

The walk back to the van was in a strengthening wind and increasing cloud cover, spoiling our last chance of locating the secretive Dartford Warbler. A distant Buzzard sat on the Ospreys' favourite tree got us excited for a minute, but alas this species too failed to show up. However, our final total of 80 species of birds, along with many insects, mammals and plants shows what a productive weekend we had.
